

**Regulation of the Thai Traditional Medical Council
Pertaining to Diseases Which Disqualify Individuals for Membership
in the Thai Traditional Medical Council
B.E. 2558 (2015)**

By virtue of Section 24 (4) (*chor*) and Section 30 Paragraph 2 of the Thai Traditional Medical Professions Act B.E. 2556 (2013), the Committee of the Thai Traditional Medical Council issues this regulation as follows:

Section 1. This regulation is called “Regulation of the Thai Traditional Medical Council Pertaining to Diseases Which Disqualify Individuals for Membership in the Thai Traditional Medical Council B.E. 2558 (2015).”

Section 2. This regulation shall enter into effect as of the day after its publication in the Government Gazette.

Section 3. The diseases which disqualify individuals for membership in the Thai Traditional Medical Council are:

- (1) leprosy in the communicable stage or when symptoms seen as repulsive to the public are visible;
- (2) advanced-stage tuberculosis;
- (3) elephantiasis in a stage when symptoms seen as repulsive to the public are visible;
- (4) chronic alcoholism;
- (5) severe addiction to narcotics;
- (6) other diseases considered by the Committee of the Thai Traditional Medical Council to be a barrier to membership in the Thai Traditional Medical Council.
